#### 'Bigger and Better by far'

was the verdict given by Peter Curston in the commentary box on the second day of the

40th Stradsett Park Vintage Rally. A new layout giving stewards the space to



expand their sections gave an exciting challenge with the theme of hay making, grass cutting and 100 year old tractors.

> To open the rally, the Reverend Alan Davies gave an adapted 'Blessing of the Plough.' before Gordon Carson declared the start of the rally with a few laps of the ring on his 1916 International Harvester 10-20 followed by commentator Alan Creasey on his 1946 Minneapolis Moline UDS



Tractor Steward, Reg Fletcher gathered together some of the tractors present at our club's first rally in 1974. Nick Ewer's unrestored 1915 Whiting Big Bull won NVTEC-EA Class Award for Best Tractor Any make 1900-1929. It was featured at our club's first rally and this is believed to be the first tractor to be used at Heacham. Also at that rally was J. Cowards' International Titan, Malcolm Bush's 1948 Fordson E27N, Gordon Carson's 1954 Turner Yeoman, Denzel Mayes' rare Turner High Clear, Peter Caley's Massey Harris 744, R. Crisp's Minneapolis Moline ZTN, Fred Rudd's Allis Chalmers, and a Field Marshall owned by Newman Smith. Simply amazing to gather them together for this 40th rally. More overleaf

Stewarded by Reg Fletcher and assistant Malcolm Bush the rally theme of 100 year old tractors saw examples dating back to 1914 with Mick Patrick's International Harvester 12-26, and his 1916 Waterloo Boy, and W. Engelman's International Junior. (not shown) The tractor parade began with the earliest models beginning with Austin West's 1919 Hart Parr 15 30, R. Wedd's 1924 I.H. 10-20, B. Ayres 1927 International Harvester 10 -20, D. Culley's 1929 Wallis 20-30 and B. Ayres 1927 I.H. 10-20

J. Crowder's 1929 Twin City, N. Ewere's 1934 International W12, J. Ayres' 1935 Allis Chalmers WC A. Smith's 1938 International F12 and J. Coward's 1933 Allis Chalmers K that won the Grace Beba trophy for Best Steel Wheeled Tractor.

The parade continued with later models from the 1940's through to the '80's. A grand total of 285 tractors!
